"NIKKI, WILD DOG OF THE NORTH"

Walt Disney's creative ability at fashioning a combined saga of human drama and animal adventure was never more masterfully illustrated than in his "Nikki, Wild Dog of the North," a Technicolor production which will be shown at the GALAX THEATRE Saturday, August 4th.
