

"FIVE WEEKS IN A BALLOON"

"Five Weeks in a Balloon," the first book published by famed nineteenth century novelist Jules Verne, is exactly 100 years old this year. As part of an International Centennial Celebration, motion picture pro-ducer Irwin Allen has filmed "Five Weeks in a Balloon" for 20th Century-Fox, and the CinemaScope-DeLuxe Color production will appear Thursday and Friday, August 23 and 24 at the GALAX THEATRE.

"Five Weeks in a Balloon" is straightforward adventure-comedy, without the science fiction elements that so preoccupied Verne later in his career. Starred in "Five Weeks in a Balloon" are Red Buttons, as a scatter-brained play-boy; Sir Cedric Hardwicke, as a (slightly) mad inventor; Fabian, as the inventor's balladeering assistant; Barbara Eden, as a beautiful missionary school teacher; Peter Lorre, as an insidious slave trader; Richard Haydn, as a British high-brow; Barbara Luna, as the mischievous native girl; and a remarkable chimpanzee named Chester (as an equally remarkable chimp named "Duchess").
