southern Canada to the Gulf of Mexico, but they leave us for the winter. In an undated leaflet written probably some thirty to forty years ago by Roger Tory Peterson, he tells us, "By the first of November, the last Chimney Swifts have left the Gulf Coast behind them. Where they go is a mystery. No one has ever seen a Chimney Swift on its wintering grounds. This is one of the great ornithological mysteries still left to be solved. Some superstitious people claim the Swifts bury themselves in the mud until spring. Others, more rational, think they probably spend the winter somewhere in tropical South America, feeding high over the jungle during the day, coming down only at dusk to rest in the hollow holes of primeval forest trees. Some day we will know."

After reading this, we turned to Peterson's "Field Guide to the Birds." There in most prosaic language was, "Chimney Swift, winters in Peru." It would be interesting to know when, how and by whom the discovery was made. We will try to find out, so, in Mr. Peterson's words, "Someday we will know."

"ESCAPE FROM ZAHRAIN"

"Escape from Zahrain," an exciting adventure-thriller set in modern Arabia, will play at the GALAX THEATRE on Saturday, August 25th. The film, in Technicolor and Panavision, stars Yul Brynner as a dedicated leader of rebel forces in a corrupt Arab state, and co-stars Sal Mineo and Jack Warden, with Madlyn Rhue.

The suspenseful drama concerns Brynner's release from captivity while awaiting execution as a traitor, his release being engineered by fanatical followers led by university student Sal Mineo. Mineo idolizes Brynner and joins forces with him and several of his fellow prisoners as they make their dash for freedom. To do so, they hijack and ambulance belonging to the oil refinery, kidnapping as hostage a company nurse, played by lovely Miss Rhue, who recently scored a hit as the ingenue in "A Majority of One."

Jack Warden will be seen as a tough American embezzler, former employee of the refinery, and one of the escapees. A sadistic killer (Tony Caruso) and a gentle murderer (Jay Novello) make up the oddly assorted group, whose lives depend upon their successful flight.

The film deals with their adventures as they cross desert and mountains, pursued by land and air, beset by privations, accidents, sandstorms, dissension and tragedy.
