DR. TRUSSELL TO LECTURE

Wet-pine-barrens of the southeast will be the subject of the illustrated lecture by Dr. Malvina Trussell tonight, August 8, at 8:00, at the Museum of Natural History.

The plants of the wet-pine-barrens are sometimes called bog plants. Dr. Trussell has been a student of the bog plants for many years. Her illustrated lecture will present the physical characteristics of bogs and the plants usually found in bogs of selected areas of the southeast. Dr. Trussell's home is near the Horse Cove bog owned by Mrs. Lis C. Howe, and which has attracted botanists for many years.

Dr. Trussell is professor of science education, Florida State University and Counselor of Nature Study, Highlands Museum of Natural History.

The lecture is open to the public. There is no admission charge for non-physicologists at the Biological Station.
