The semi-parasitic flowering plants
 will be the subject of an illustrated lec-
 ture by Dr. Martin A. Piehl at the Museum
 of Natural History. The lecture is sched-
 uled for August 6 at 8:00 p.m.

Dr. Piehl, formerly with the Santa
 Barbara Botanic Garden, is on the botany
 staff of the University of Michigan. He
 has done extensive research on the ecology,
 morphology and evolution of the root-parasitic
 angiosperms. Dr. Piehl is new in
 residence at the Biological Station con-
 tinuing his research on the semi parasitic
