RASHOMON, the play by Fay and Michael Kanin that caused New York critics and audiences to search for new superlatives when it was seen on Broadway in 1959, will be the next attraction at the Highlands Com-

munity Theatre. Based on the same two short stories by Japanese writer Ryunosuke Akutagawa, which were the basis for the famous Japanese film, the play will open for two nights on Friday and Saturday, August 14th and 15th.
