AN 80TH ANNIVERSARY

In 1884, when the village of Highlands was nine years old, its leading citizens met to elect the first officers and trustees of the Hudson Library Association. The purpose of this newly-formed organization was to conduct the affairs of the Hudson Library. At this meeting S. T. Kelsey, the founder of Highlands, was elected president, and T. Baxter White, the first postmaster, was elected vice-president. Today, four score years later, this organization, now known as the Hudson Library of Highlands, North Carolina, Incorporated, is still very much alive.

The library itself had been started several years previously and early records show that by 1883 it (CON'D ON PAGE 10)

He is in great demand and recently appeared before audiences at the Asheville-Biltmore College and several garden clubs in the state. Dr. Justice is cooperating with the botany department of the University of North Carolina in the study of the flora of the Carolinas.
