

Dr. C. Leland Rodgers will open the lecture series at the Museum of Natural History, Thursday, July 8, 8:00 P. M., in Museum Building. His talk on life on the American deserts will be illustrated with kodachromes.

Dr. Rodgers is chairman of the biology department of Furman University. His research field is plant taxonomy. During the past four years Dr. Rodgers has participated in the gorge research program of the Highlands Biological Station. He has surveyed the plants of the Horsepas-ture and Bearcamp Creek gorge area and his work has been accepted for publication by two leading scientific journals.
