George Dewey Hopper, 62, died in C. J. Harris Community Hospital in Sylva Monday after an illness of several months.

He was a carpenter and painter, and active in the work of Highlands Methodist Church where he was a steward and a member of the official board.

Mr. Hopper's first wife, Mrs. Evelyn Cleaveland Hopper, died in 1961, and in 1963 he married Mrs. Helen Holt Coffee, who survives. He was a son of the late Monroe Hopper.
