MEMORIES FROM THE HILLS

LAWRENCE E. WOOD

The last major battle between the early settlers and the Cherokee Indians was in September, 1782. Prior to that date, General Rutherford passed through Macon County during his march against the Indians in 1776, burning several towns. Sugartown was among those burned and it was never rebuilt. About 1820 Silas McDowell bought the site and built a home for his mother.

In 1782, soldiers were called out to stop the warring Cherokees. They found the Indians camped at the Town House Field in the Cullowhee Valley and chased them across Cullowhee Gap to Elli-

On September 10th a Corporal White was killed. Very little is known about him, but his grave is near the bank of the Cullasaja River and has and is an object of great interest to all who see it. His body was brought across the river and buried by his fellow soldiers, who hid his grave in order to prevent the Indians from taking his scalp. About 1895 a stone was placed at Corporal White's grave by the residents of Macon County.

For many years the old Ledford Field was covered with piles of stones where the Indians had placed them over their dead.
