## GOLD MOUNTAIN TO OPEN SATURDAY

Gold City, Western North Carolina's authentic replica of a gold mining town, which opened last week, will stage its official or formal opening Saturday.

The Franklin Chamber of Commerce has invited scores of public, civic, and business leaders to the 9 a.m. - 5 p.m. event, with Gov. Dan Moore heading the guest list.

Gold City is perched in the clouds, one mile high atop Gold Mountain, and looks down on 1,467 Smoky Mountain Peaks called "The Garden of the Gods".

The magnificent 360-degree view is virtually of wildness, with only a portion of Franklin visible from Gold City's observation platform. The summit is reached by a modern chairlift, which can handle 600 passengers hourly with access on U. S. Highways 23-441, five miles north of Franklin. (CON'T ON PAGE 10)
