SEARCH FOR CENDA ENDS

The body of Lucinda Schweers, a small four year old Atlanta girl, was found Monday afternoon in a lake about 12:15.

The discovery was the result of five days of intensive searching which began approximately 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 5.

Mrs. Schweers and her three children arrived in Highlands about 4:00 p.m. Wednesday for a vacation. About 6:30 p.m. the children, Lucinda and her brother age 6 and the children of the family with whom she was visiting, went for a walk down a path near the house. Mrs. Schweer said she glanced out the window and saw Cenda playing in the sand in the yard. Evidently Cenda had decided not to go for a walk. Mrs. Schweer went after the other children and when she returned Cenda had disappeared.

Mrs. Schweer made a frantic search for Cenda driving the dirt roads in her
