DEATH TAKES JACK H. WILCOX

Mr. Jack H. Wilcox, prominent High-lands resident, died unexpectedly Sunday morning, July 14, at his home on Billy Cabin Mountain at the age of 70.

Mr. Wilcox was born in Halifax, Nova Scotia, on January 9, 1898. He served in the U. S. Army in World War I on the Western Front with the famous 69th regiment of the Rainbow Division. He later received degrees from the University of Wisconsin and Vanderbilt University, and taught in Adult Education in Wisconsin.

In 1932 he was married to Virginia Randall. He and Mrs. Wilcox moved to Highlands in 1936 to develop their Billy Cabin Farm.

Mr. Wilcox served as Town Clerk of Highlands from 1943 - 1946. During that time he helped in reducing the indebted-

ness of the town.
During 1946-1947 he taught at Missouri Valley College in Marshall, Missouri, where he was Dean of Men and Chairman of the Department of Economics. He taught economics at the University of Tennessee in the school of Business Administration from 1948 until his retirement in 1960.

He was one of the original founders of the Highlands Community Theatre in 1939 (CONTINUED ON PAGE TWELVE)
