(LOST AT SEA, CONTINUED FROM PAGE FIVE) at which time Mr. Gamber requested and received permission from the Miami Center for a northeast deviation from course in order to avoid some thunderstorm build-ups. Fifty minutes later Mr. Gamber was in a relayed radio communication contact via a Pan American airliner. This was the last contact with the aircraft.

Since the aircraft was reported lost, one of the most intensive search and rescue operations ever conducted in Bahamian waters was carried out by both the U. S. and Bahamian government search and rescue squadrons as well as by innumerable friends in private aircraft.

No trace of the aircraft or its occupants had been discovered until the middle of last week, when an antenna and wing tip, known to be part of the aircraft, washed up on the south shore of the island, Grand Bahama. The existing evidence is reported to be insufficient to determine the cause of the catastrophe.

Mr. Gamber is survived by his wife, Athley, son Clayton, Jr., the father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Earl Gamber of Hendersonville, and a sister, Evelyn.

CAR TRIP

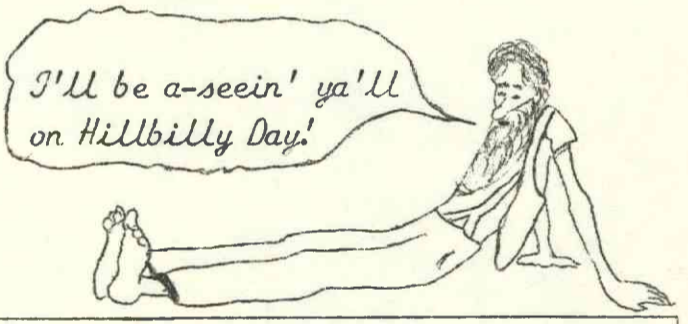

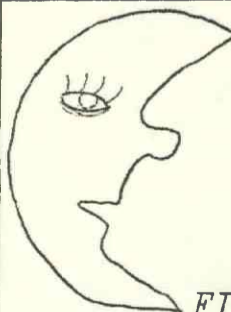
