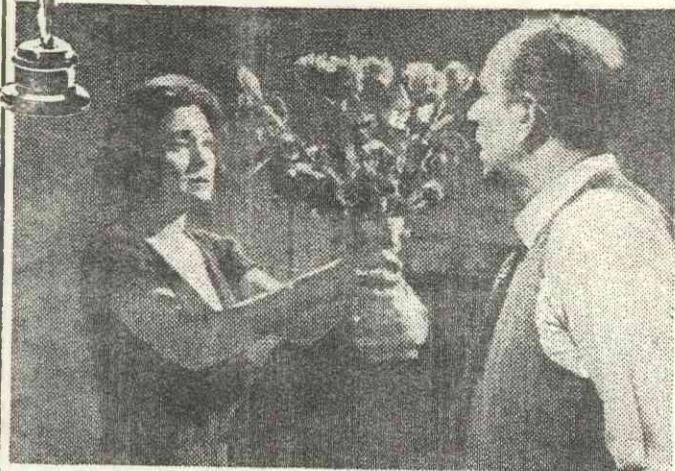

This latter way of working could soon put the Hospital in bankruptcy so it is forced to take drastic steps to collect these accounts.
