If you hold a current Blood Donor Credit Card, arrangements can be made with most Cut-of-Region hospitals to furnish the blood needed. You should contact your local Red Cross Chapter to have such arrangements made through the Blood Center. Always contact your Red Cross regarding blood needed in an Cut-of-Region hospital.

Why should I consider giving blood even more often than to assure the needed transfusions for me and my

family?

A. To make blood available for patients in V.A. Hospitals and Military Installation Hospitals.

B. To further increase the amount which is being used in the form of blood derivatives - frozen plasma, serum albumin, gamma globulin and fibrinogen C. To further increase the reserve supply to be used for disasters and special types of emergencies.

D. To dedicate my additional certificate to some family whose members are not able to qualify as blood denors.

GEORGIA BORDER TEAM CLAIMS SUCCESS

A Georgia legislator who claims North Carolina is occupying part of his state checked Tar Heel records Monday, proclaiming his trip " a great success."

But North Carolina Governor Bob Scott said he wasn't ready to call for a boundary commission to settle the

dispute.

In a letter to Georgia Governor Jimmy Carter, Scott wrote that the "State of North Carolina does not feel any great urgency to reopen the question which has been debated since about 1806.

"Since the State of Georgia and the State of North Carolina have lived peacefully during the 170 years of this dispute, and since neither of our states have appeared to suffer because of this problem, I do not see any need to rush into it now," Scott wrote.

Scott said he would seek "some direction from our General Assembly" before acting. The North Carolina legislature meets in October, but that session has been restricted to higher education. Its next regular session is in January 1973.

Scott however, indicated he might settle for recommendations from

legisflative leaders.

Scott's letter to Carter was made public while Georgia State Rep. Larry Thomason was discussing the boundary dispute with North Carolina gubenatorial legal aide Fred Morrison.
