In the long range planning it is estimat-ed that some 2,000 additional picnic and camping units will be provided to accomodate the expected travellers who will use the Blue Ridge Parkway when completed some time in the future.

The subject of timber cutting was discussed at great length and many questions were answered. There are two methods known as clear cutting and selective cutting. Advantages of the clear cutting method, which many ecologists have objected to, are that it is more economical. and that better trees can be planted to replace those removed. The main objection seems to be that the area cut over looks bad for a number of years until the new trees grow to a certain height. The areas proposed for this type of treatment are limited in size to 50 acres and a space of at least one mile must separate clear cut locations. A total of 150 acres to be clear cut is presently programmed, less than one half of one percent of the so called General Forest Zone.

Also planned is creation of additional recreation areas to use 300 acres dur-
