Bulldogs Sink Guilford Quakers In Opener

Three Run Burst In Fifth Gives Locals 6-3 Win

MOYE WINS

The Bulldogs of Atlantic Christian College shook off a "jinx" that has been haunting them during their past two North State Conference baseball seasons and captured the opening game of their 1939 slate by downing the Guilford College Quakers, 6 to 3, in showers and sunshine. The win was their first since the 1936 campaign.

Base hits were at a premium as Moye kept the seven garnered by the Quakers widely scattered and Acree and Leach, Quaker flingers, also were stingy, allowing the Bulldogs only five. Bases on balls were the order of the day, a total of 21 free tickets being issued by the three tossers—six of the dozen the Bulldogs received were turned into runs. Moye whiffed five while only two Bulldogs were set down on strikes.

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Catawba Indians Rally For 8-5 Win

Brown Taken Out Of Box In The Fifth

The Catawba College Indians rallied for four runs in the final three frames to come from behind and nose out the Atlantic Christian College Bulldogs, 8 to 5 in the opener of a two-game series.

Outwit, 14 to 9, the Indians mixed timely bingles with walks and misplays in the closing frame to win, while Herring, who took over the mound duties when Brown was sneezed to cover, stopped the bulldog offense cold. He gave up three hits in four innings while Brown was the victim of an 11-run assault in five frames.

Catawba opened the scoring in the initial inning on Morgan's triple and a sacrifice fly. The Bulldogs filled the bases in the second but were repulsed without a tally. In the third, however, singles by Lucas, Johnson, Gardner, Boykin, and Lassiter sent three runs across the rubber. The Indians went out in front again at 4-3 as a single by Morgan and three baggers by Davis and Poole and a sacrifice fly let in three runs in the fifth.

In the home half the Bulldogs regained the lead at 5-4 as Gardner and Boykin singled. Lassiter sacrificed them down a peg and Gardner scored on a wild pitch. Boykin counted on Windley's sacrifice fly.

A walk, error, long fly, a double base on balls and a second steal in the visitors' seventh deadlocked the scoring. In the eighth the Indians broke the knot as one run was scored on a single, stolen base and an error. The game was put on ice in the ninth as a double, a walk, single and fielder's choice let in two additional counters. The Bulldogs set down in order in the sixth, seventh and eighth innings, opened the ninth with successive singles but Herring tightened up and fanned two of the next three men to face him.

The bulldog batters couldn't cope with the hurling of the "Beaver" from Guilford and when the smoke of the battle had died away Shell had struck out 21 Bulldog batsmen in 9 innings and had allowed only 5 hits, while the Quaker batters pounded Elm City's Joe Laughinghouse for 16 hits as the Bulldog pitcher found himself unable to fan more than 6 Guilford men.
