That smallcase, called the "mezu-zah," was the gaurdian of the door. Everyone who saw it there was reminded that only such things as could pass the tests of God's word must be allowed to enter the house or come out of it.

In this day of trial and trouble we seem to have for gotten that we should have a guardian at our door. Not to keep people out but to keep trouble and morbid at-mosphere out. This love given by God is so stormy no power on earth could penetrate it. One method of getting this love is thru one-sentence table blessing well memorized and sincerely spoken. Another is to be led in prayer by one of the great leaders of the church, whose prayer maybe read from some books of devotions. This may be a most

insviring approach to God. All that I have said may be summed up here. Keeping religion alive within the home is the most important. The mother who is eager to hold out of her home what should in full assurance in the Unseen Helper who is with her in the house. For the Master has told us, "Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: is any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will say with him, and he with me."
