JACK MCCOMAS

Jack McComas, former Indiana high school basketball star, standout in basketball in the Armed Forces, later a hoop star for Everett Case at N. C. State College and a professional baseball luminary, came to Atlantic Christian College in the fall of 1951. His purpose—to give Atlantic Christian College a representative team in the North State Conference. He is continually and progressively working toward this goal.

It is almost a certainty that this year's team will be the best that he has fielded at ACC. Last year's aggregation was an improvement over his first team.

He is aided at ACC by Thomas Pritchard, another professional baseball star, who now has retired. Pritchard also is a former ACC basketball performer. He serves as assistant varsity coach and head coach of Atlantic Christian's junior varsity basketball team.

CHARLES HUTCHINS

Forward 6-4 170 18 Freshman from Winston-Salem, N. C. played basketball last season for Mineral Springs High School and made all-county team. Team lost out in district "AA" playoffs. Outstanding student. Good rebounder and team leader. Could break into the starting lineup before the season is completed.

KELLY BYRUM

Forward 5-11 165 22 Junior from Ryland, N. C. only senior on the ACC squad. Played first year for the Bulldogs last season after two years at Campbell Junior College where he was captain of the team. Also plays baseball. Is married. Majoring in science. Played in 23 games for the Bulldogs last season scoring 129 points for a 5.6 average.

Forward 6-7 207 Sophomore from Rocky Mount, N. C. Entered ACC at mid-term last year and played eight games for the Bulldogs. Scored 106 points for an average of 13.3. Veteran in the Air Force. Was outstanding for Air Force teams on the West Coast and was named to the All-Air Force team. Ex-

pected to help the height situation on the team. Good rebounder. Majoring in physical education.

Guard 5-9 155 21 Junior from Goldsboro, N. C. Transfer from Campbell Junior College where he was high scorer and was named to the North Carolina Junior College all-conference team last season. Good floor man, and team leader. Outstanding baseball player at short-stop. Played high school football, basketball and baseball at Goldsboro High.

JERRY WILLIAMS

Forward 6-2 190 20 Sophomore from Fuquay Springs, N. C. played varsity ball at ACC last season scoring 223 points in 24 games for an average of 9.2 points per game. Played four years of high school basketball and was the outstanding man in the Fuquay area. Plans to major in social studies and physical education.

Forward 6-3 175 18 Freshman from Greensboro, N. C. played forward for the strong Greensboro High School team last year. Just turned 18 and is the youngest player on the team. Has shown great promise in early practices. Scored 200 points in 20 games for Greensboro last season.

RONALD BAKER Guard 6-1 158 20 Freshman from Kipling, N. C.

JOHN MARLEY Center 6-10 222 19 Freshman from Franklinville, N. C. was tallest high school player in North Carolina last season. Team lost out in district "A" playoffs. Averaged 37 points per game. BILL TOMLINSON Guard 5-10 165 22 Freshman from Wilson, N. C.

Korean veteran. Left ACC in 1950 after playing only half the season to enter the Army. Was leading scorer at the time he was drafted. Made all-conference and all-state at Charles L. Coon High School in Wilson where he played for Hank Madden. Played in the 1950 East-West game. Played basketball for Fort Jackson while in the service seeing action in 30 games for a point total of 250.

BILLY WIDGEON Guard 6-1 155 18 Freshman from Newport, N. C.

Outstanding leader of the state "A" champs last season at Newport High under Wayne Benton. Made all-State after leading his team to the title by scoring 609 points in 33 games. Played in the high school East-West game where he was outstanding. Considered by many coaches to be the outstanding prospect in the state. Made all-county for three straight years.

JIM HEBBE Forward 6-0 185 20 Junior from Shelbyville, Ind.

has been switched from guard where he was a regular last season to forward. Is looking good at the new position which he played in high school under Frank Barnes at Shelbyville. Made all-conference in high school. Good set-shot man and fine playmaker. Scored 210 points in 24 games for the Bulldogs last year for an average of 8.7 points per game.

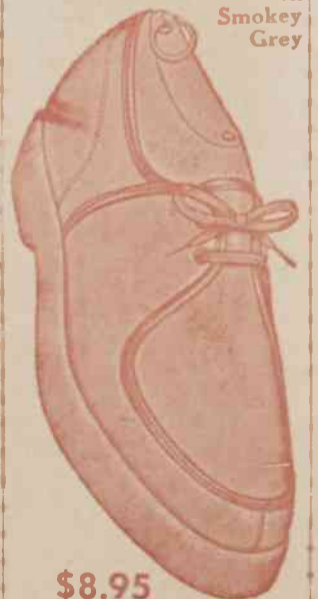
