of Church History at the College of the Bible, Lexington, Ky., to accept the post as Editor of "The Christian-Evangelist."

During the years he has served on the faculty of The College of the Bible, Dr. Short has become one of the best known leaders within the Christian Churches. He has spoken for virtually every state convention held by Christian Churches all over the nation.

His book "Doctrine And Thought Of The Disciples Of Christ," has had eight editions. He also has written another book, "Unity Is Our Business," and he contributed a chapter for the book, "Women In The Church." The latter grew out of his work with the National Council of Churches' Committee on the Cooperation of Men and Women in the Church.

Dr. Short is keenly interested in Christian unity and has worked for World Council of Churches in several capacities. He was director of an ecumenical work camp at Hochst, Germany, where he supervised the work of 50 young people from all parts of the world in beginning construction of a youth conference grounds.

In 1952 he was an official delegate to the Third World Conference on Faith and Order, held at Lud, Sweden. In 1953 Dr. Short served as the first American exchange professor with the World Council of Churches. He lectured at pastors' seminars in German universities and then served on the first faculty at the Graduate School for Ecumenical Studies at Bossey, Switzerland.

Before going to The College of

the Bible, Dr. Short was a member of the faculty at Hiram College, and he has held pastorates in Ohio, Massachusetts, Illinois, and a number of interim pastorates in Ohio and Kentucky.

Dr. Short is a native of southern Indiana. He earned his A. B. degree at Eureka College, his B. D. and Ph. D. degrees at Hartford Seminary.
