

# Delta Sigma Phi Leads Men's Intramurals

Delta Sigma Phi has jumped off to a fast lead in the Men's Intramural League. This was made possible by Aubrey Smith's first place finish in clock golf.

Delta Sig, which has 34 points at this time, is closely followed by the Hackney Day Students who have 32 points. Sigma Pi with 28 points, and Sigma Phi Epsilon with 26 points.

The results of the first week of football competition find the Hackney Day Students "A" team in first place. The team led by Willie Crowder, Andy Borland, Bill Frazier, and Nick Nichols crushed Alpha Sigma Phi by the score of 28-0, Delta Sigma Phi by the score 12-6, and the Hackney Day Students "C" team by the score 26-0.

Second place in the league standings is occupied by the Hackney Day Students "B" team on the strength of their two wins and one tie record. The Hackney "B" team opened the season with a hard-fought 6-0 victory over Sigma Phi Epsilon. They also defeated Alpha Sigma Phi by the score 13-0. In a hard played game with Sigma Pi, the Hackney "B" men played to a 6-6 stand-off.

Sigma Pi is in third place with one win and one tie. They defeated Delta Sigma Phi by the convincing score of 26-0. The only blemish on their record is a 6-6 tie with the Hackney Day Students "B" team.

Sigma Phi Epsilon rebounded from a 6-0 loss to the Hackney "B" team by crushing the Hackney "C" team by the score of 27-0. The Sig Eps were led in scoring by Gene Byerly, Dave Mustian, Ken Odom, and Dick Ullom.

Delta Sigma Phi, Alpha Sigma Phi, and the Hackney "C" team have not reached the winners circle so far this season.

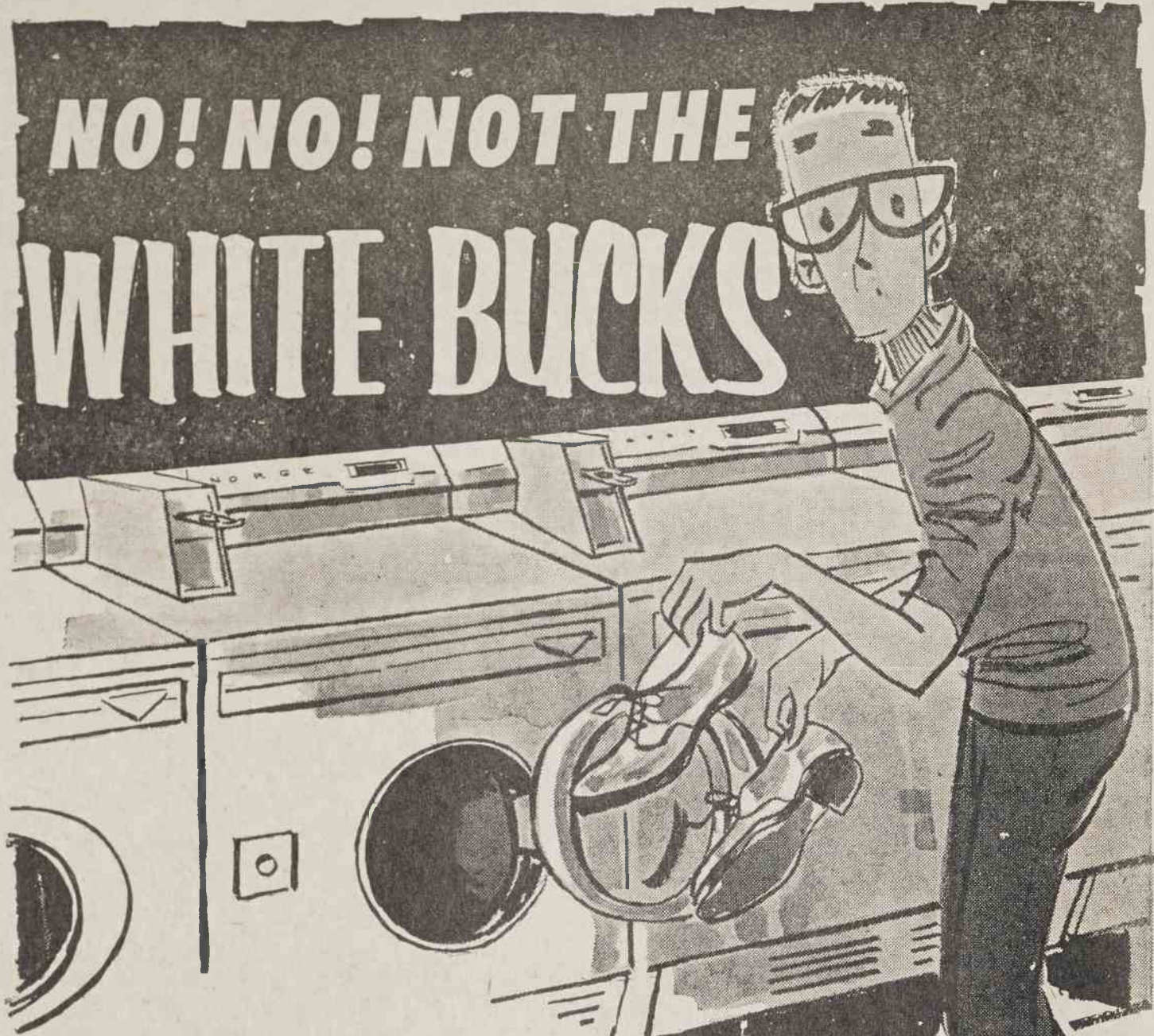
