

New Parking Regulations Are Approved at Atlantic Christian

New parking regulations for Atlantic Christian College have been approved by the Administrative Council and will go into effect on September 1 of this year.

Section I Registration of motor vehicles

All full time resident students, including those living in approved college housing, and all commuting and part-time students parking motor vehicles on college property, must register their motor vehicle with the Dean of Student's Office. This regulation includes student owned and — or operated vehicles.

Section 11 Registration Fee

The fee for registration of student vehicles is 25 cents for the academic year from September to June. This registration fee must be

paid during the first two weeks of the semester in which the student enrolls. Vehicles brought to the campus following the registration period must be registered with the Dean of Student's Office within 24 hours, Saturday and Sunday excluded.

Upon payment of the fee and registration, each student is given a registration permit. This permit must be displayed on the lower right hand corner of the rear window. If it is necessary to replace the permit, it will be done without cost upon the presentation of a portion of the original.

Section III Student Parking Regulations.

Students are prohibited from parking at anytime on college property, except in the areas which have been designated for student parking. Only residents of Hackney Hall are to park in the area behind Hackney Hall, and only residents of the women's dormitories are to park in the area behind Harper Hall Annex. The parking lot behind the Science Building is open to both students and faculty. The parking lot by the Music Building is reserved for faculty use only.

Section IV Penalties

Non - registered vehicles, and those parked in unauthorized areas, will be given campus parking tickets. A \$2 fine will be charged students receiving tickets for parking in unauthorized areas, or failing to register their automobiles.

Failure to answer a summons with regard to a parking violation will result in appropriate college disciplinary action.

Section V General Provisions

Student registration stickers must be displayed in the appropriate place.

Student owner, operator and—all registrant of a motor vehicle is responsible for any violation incurred by that vehicle.

Violations of traffic regulations for driving conduct prejudicial to the best interest to the college may result in revocation of driving privileges and appropriate disciplinary action.

Resident sophomore junior and senior women who maintain a "C" (2.00) average may be permitted to have automobiles on campus.

Freshmen resident women students may not have automobiles.

Men or women students may be requested by the Deans to return cars to their home if in the opinion of the Dean the possession of the automobile is interfering with scholastic or campus adjustment.

Section VI Effective Date

These parking regulations have

been approved by the Administrative Council and are to become effective with the opening of college in September 1964.
