

\$5.00 Fine Will Begin On Jan. 5

At a recent meeting of the College Administrative Council, new regulations were passed regarding traffic and parking violations. The Council noted that, in spite of the improved parking facilities developed in recent months, numerous students are parking in areas which hinder the flow of traffic. Accordingly, effective January 5, 1970, tickets will be placed on all cars which are unregistered or illegally parked. A \$5.00 fine will be assessed for each violation. Fines are to be paid in the Business Office in the Administration Building. Tickets will be written for the following reasons: (1) unregistered vehicles, (2) Parking in no parking areas, (3) Parking in drive way or circulation drive, (4) parking in unassigned parking lot, (5) Blocking other traffic, (6) Parking in a reserved parking space.

Anyone who is presently driving an unregistered vehicle is encouraged to register it with the Dean of Student's secretary in the Student Center. Everyone
