## OCT18 SGA Congregates

The Senate met for its bimonthly meeting on Sept. 27, 1979. Some interesting committee reports ensued after the meeting was called to order at 6:15 p.m. The chairperson of the Charter Renewal Committee, John Clyburn, read a list of the organizations that has petitioned for campus organizational recognition and moved that the Senate accept them. The Senate so moved and the list was publicized in last week's Collegiate. Clyburn also introduced a proposed new organiz-ation, Delta Sigma Theta; they

also received Senate approval. Carl Frazier, of the Grievance Committee, reported from their meeting with Dean Davis that the dean is aware that some professors are not keeping with the rules of the absenteeism policy established by the school. Dean Davis said that those teachers not following the policy of giving a written notice to their students regarding their absenteeism rule, will be subject to reprimand and a note of such action will be included in their college folders. Frazier also reported that Dean Davis has changed the times for exams. In the past, exam hours have been 8:00-10:00, 11:00-1:00, and 3:00-5:00. They now will be 9:00-11:00, 12:00-2:00 and 3:00-5:00.

The Constitution and Bylaws Committee will have a report after their next meeting.

Catherine Edwards of the Cafeteria Food Committee introduced ARA Director Steve Cummings to the Senate. He spoke briefly on his concerns pertaining to student needs and the ability and willingness of the cafeteria staff to meet them.

Under old business, SB#1, the proposed budget, was passed. The Election Committee does not have its required number of members, and students are still being sought to fill the available positions.

A few items were brought to the Senate floor under new business. Bob Vartanian asked that an explanation for the newly charged parking fees be investigated by the Grievance Committee. After announce-ments, the Senate was adjourned by David Webb.

On Oct. 4, 1979, a special Senate meeting was called, the main order of business being the State of the Association Address given by SGA President George T. Murphy. A copy of the address is on file in the SGA office.

At the completion of the State of the Association address, a meeting of the Senate was called by Speaker David Webb. A resolution was introduced by Edwards to honor the A.C. NAIA 1979 tennis champions. The resolution passed by acclaimation and will be printed in the Collegiate.

# Wenner featured in Art Gallery

This month's exhibit in A.C.'s Case Art Gallery is a onewoman show of twenty-seven pastels and watercolors. Jean Wenner of Jacksonville, N.C. is the featured artist. Her association as President of the Onslow County Arts Council, President of the Onslow Art Society and as a board member of the North Carolina Association of Arts Councils can explain her local, rural, and beach motifs. The majority of the works, however, are still-lifes. The most outstanding one is titled "Cabbage and Turnips." In this one work. the intent is clear, and the colors stand out from the maroon background and are able to represent through depth and the freshness of color the artist's most defined work. The other

works are water colors or watercolors and pastels combined.

Mr. Chris Wilson, a member of the art faculty, commented, "The works are sincere. The pastels are handled well; the best of them are visual poetry. The restrained touch and delicate colorations are refreshing in a world of neon, plastic and loud music which lacks melody. The artist's enthusiasm for the unobtrusive is well communicated." Wenner's works are appeasing to the eye. The subject matter for the works are not entirely original, but a few are handled well. For example, the pastel 'Bouquet' shows a vase and flowers as a combination of geometric design, tex-
