Prospective teachers who plan to take the National Teacher Examinations on Feb. 16, at Atlantic Christian College were reminded today they have less than two weeks to register with the Educational Testing Service (ETS), Princeton, N.J.

Craig Falor, director of career planning and placement at Atlantic Christian said registrations should be mailed in time to reach ETS no later than Jan.23 when regular registration closes. A penalty fee of \$5 is charged for registrations received at ETS after Jan. 23 but prior to Jan. 30. After Jan. 30 registrations will not be accepted for the February administration. Those taking the Common Examinations will report at 8:30 a.m., and finish at about 12:30 p.m., Falor said. Area Examinations are scheduled from 1:30 p.m. to about 4:15 p.m.


