with 0-2 marks.

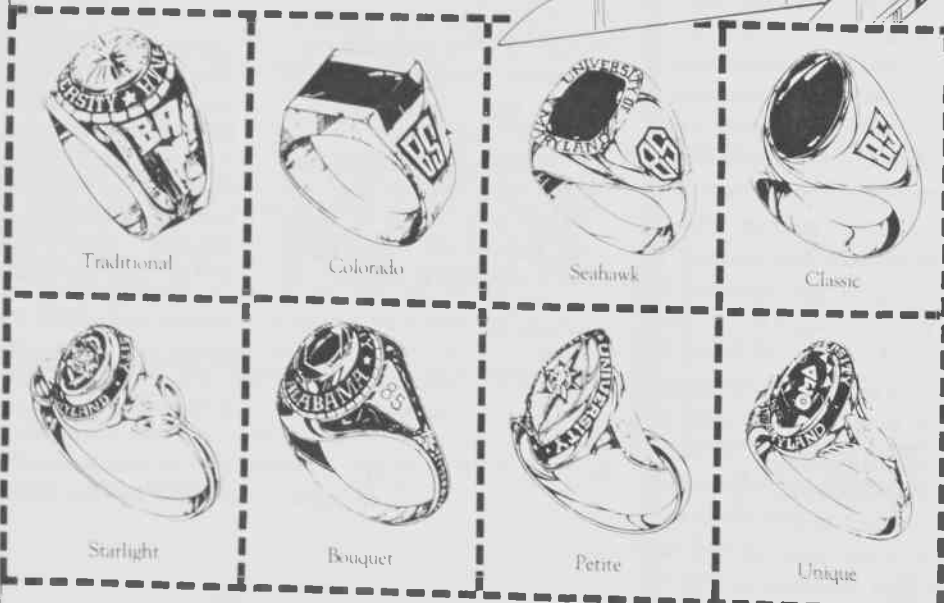
This week's games can be found at the bottom of the board standings. The first two games listed under each date are to be played at 4pm, and the other two contests are to be played at 5pm.
