She did, bringing Woolworth to its knees and threatening other segregated department stores with lunch counters in the South. Soon all segregated stores yielded to pressure and allowed all human beings to sit down at lunch counters to be served in a decent, respectful fashion.

Gloria graduated from Bennett and earned a master's degree in social work from Columbia University. She worked at the Spofford Juvenile Center in Bronx, New York, for 31 years. She volunteered as executive director of a youth program which provided recreational, cultural, vocational and educational activities for after-school and summer programs. For her dedication and hard work she received the John V. Lindsay Award from the Citizens'Committee in 1993.

If Gloria leaves a legacy for Bennett College students, faculty, administration, staff, and African-Americans, it will be found in her words: "I don't fool myself that there are no more bridges to cross. You've got the youth and hopefully the enthusiasm and purpose.

We must move forward. You have to make a commitment or all the work which has ben done before will be for naught. We are depending on you."

The Graduate School of Baylor College of Medicine in Houston sponsors a10-week program, the Summer Medical and Research Training Program(SMART), which gives aspiring scientists first-hand experience through work in laboratory or clinical settings. Participants also attend seminars and educational activities.

Acceptance into the national program is highly competitive, with more than 700 applicants for approximately 100 positions.

Selection is based on the applicant's commiment to an excellent prepartion Since 1989, 471 students have participated in the SMART Program, and more than 85 percent of the participaticipants have already entered graduate or medical school.

The program is funded in part by the Pew Charitable Trusts and the National Science Foundation.
