Two members from the Belles volleyball team, Tamara Adams, junior from California and Laticia Jolly, sophomore from Ohio were also named to the team.

As to taking the first place trophy home for the second year in a row, Barber-Scotia also took the MVP (Most Valuable Player) award home for the third year in a row.

The Bennett College volleyball team completed their last week of games with an overall record of 10-4, and will be attending the Mary Baldwin Invitational on Oct. 21-22.
