Films like The Hurricane, The Green Mile, and The Best Man are what we need more of as opposed to Booty Call, I Got the Hook-Up, and The Player's Club. I've seen the latter films and while I was entertained, it didn't take much thought to watch those films. Too often, we get the films with the one Black character who makes the jokes (Will Smith in Men in Black and Chris Tucker in Rush Hour) and not the films where the Black character truly affects the outcome (The Negotiator 's Samuel L. Jackson and The Matrix's Laurence Fishburne.)

But we also should take responsibility because we support the Scream 3's and not the Love and Basketball's. Black filmmaking is beginning to improve, but we still have a long way to go. Until then, Duncan and Denzel will just have to settle for just sitting in the audience at the Oscars.
