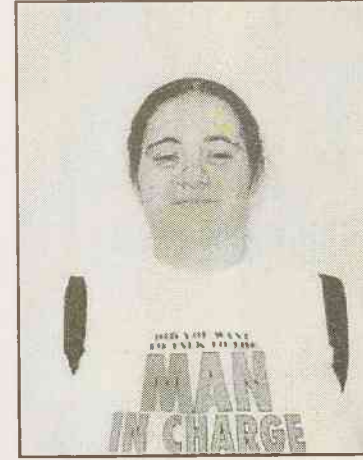

I'll remember my little sisters, my friends, ACES, and my [academic] adviser.



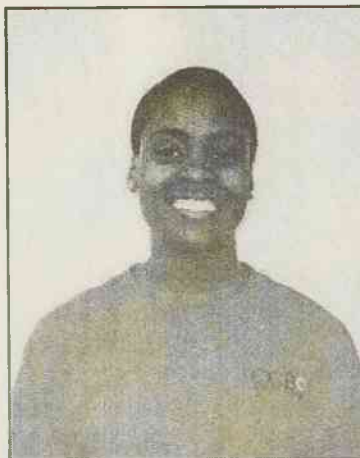
