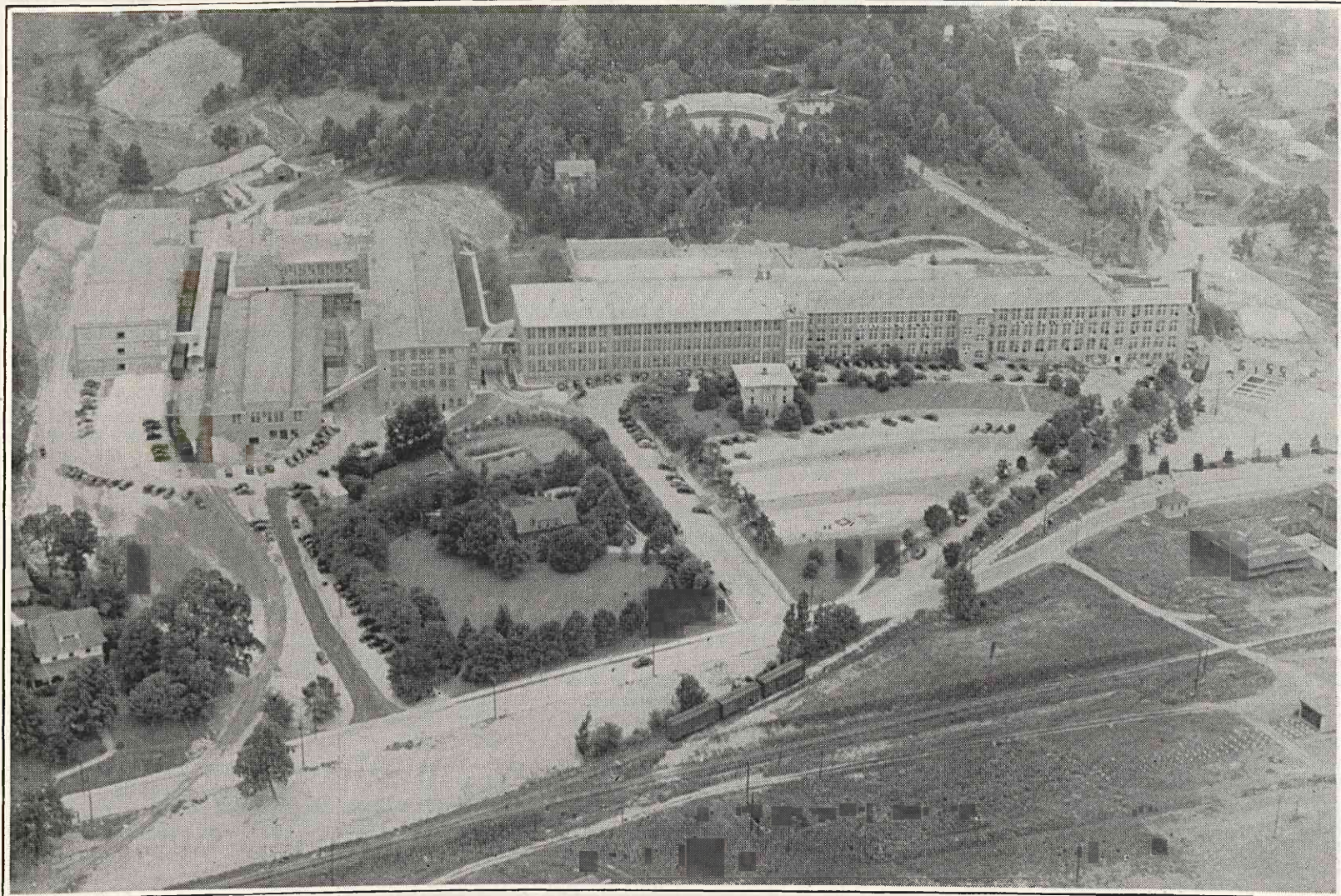




Chatham Manufacturing Company As Seen From the Air
