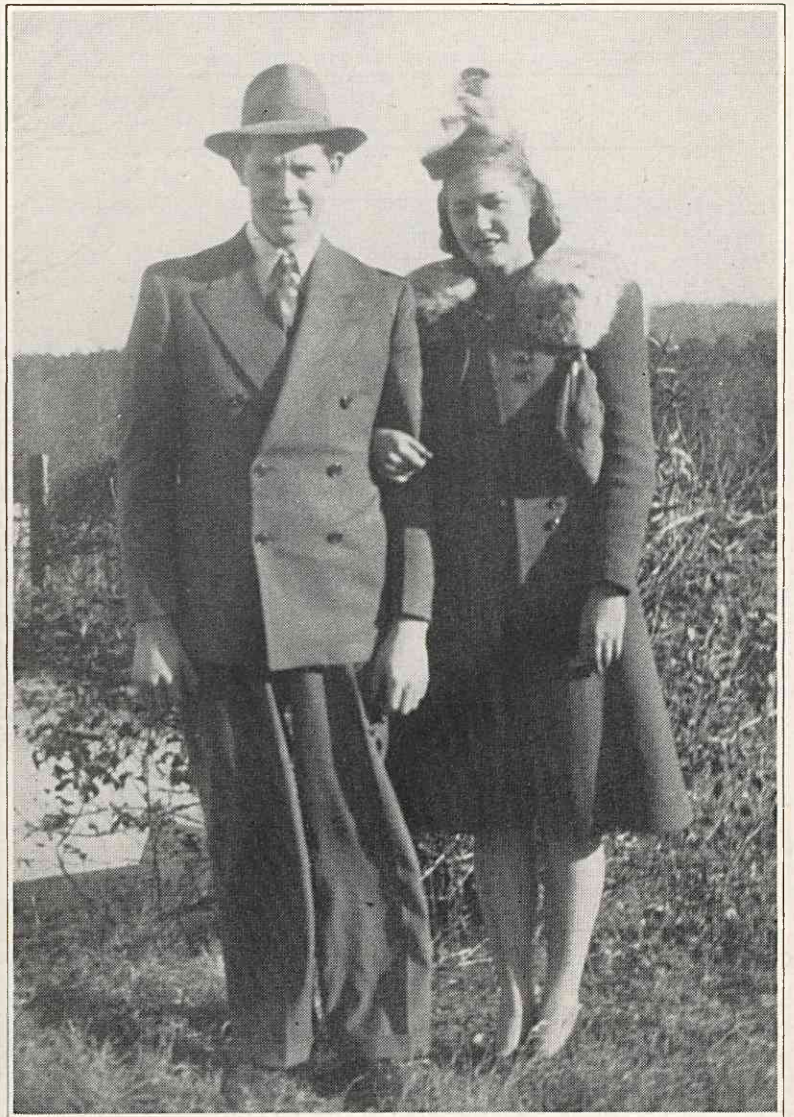


Chatham Red Cross Honor Roll
