MISSES THE MOUNTAINS

June 10, 1943

Dear Mr. Straus:

I wish so much that I could visit you all at Ecusta. The heat here is terrific. I wish I could see the cool mountain streams and woods. As I have remarked before, this section is very lacking in trees. We are on a flat, without more than two dozen trees, and those lining the highway in town. Naturally, after being accustomed to a profusion of trees and shrubs, this barrenness of trees is noticeable. The scenery is beautiful because of its grandeur.

I just returned from a convoy across the mountains. Everywhere I could see the results of enemy action. Even though I was through most of it, the traveling I did was at night so I could not see the actual damage.

We read about the good work most manufacturing plants are doing. We feel elated—"the good old U. S. A. is backing us." When we read about strikes and demands for higher and higher wages, we wonder, "Do they realize the magnitude of this struggle? Are they doing their part?" We over here who have given up our homes and jobs are alarmed. We rejoice at the realization that these are only a small part of our wonderful country—an inevitable percentage in everything no matter how fine and good. (I went off on quite a speech there—hope you understand.)

As you noticed, I am using the stationery Ecusta sent me Christmas. I have enjoyed it immensely and still am, as a matter of fact. It is good to know that folks at home still think of us.
