These Girls Piloted The Women's Bowling Teams

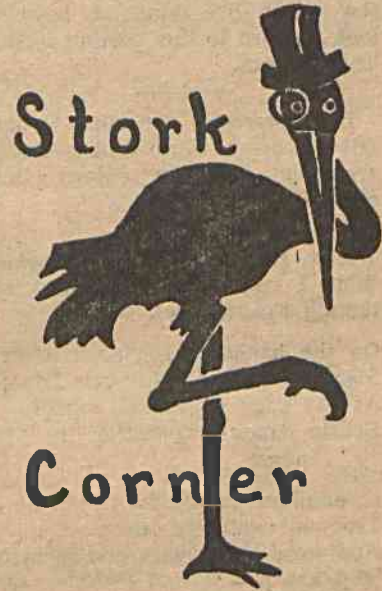
