

Fishing To Start At Camp Sapphire Aug. 1

The pass, which will be issued by the Personnel Department, will be taken by the employee to the main office at Camp Sapphire where he will check in prior to fishing. At the end of the day, or prior to leaving camp, he will again check in at the Sapphire office, reporting the size and number of fish caught so that records can be kept. Mr. Gasque is extremely interested in the data concerning the fish caught in order that he will have the necessary information to determine types and quantity of fish most suitable to the lake.

In view of the fact this is the first time since the lake has been stocked that fishing has been permitted, fishing will necessarily be limited to employees only and the number of fishermen to ten per day.

Until such time as Mr. Gasque can decide the quantity of fish available to be caught, no employee can be issued more than one pass and each pass will entitle the holder to a catch of not more than five (5) blue gill (brim) of less than 6 inches in length and one (1) bass of not less than 11 inches in length.

The closing date will be determined by Mr. Gasque according to the condition of the lake and how well we comply with his instructions. If it is found that the lake will be left open longer than anticipated, announcement will be made accordingly and employees permitted an additional day of fishing.

Since fishing in the lake this year is entirely for recreation and all limits on fish are necessarily lifted, all employees are requested to be good sportsmen in following the rules so that the privilege of fishing in the lake can be extended to a greater number of the people.

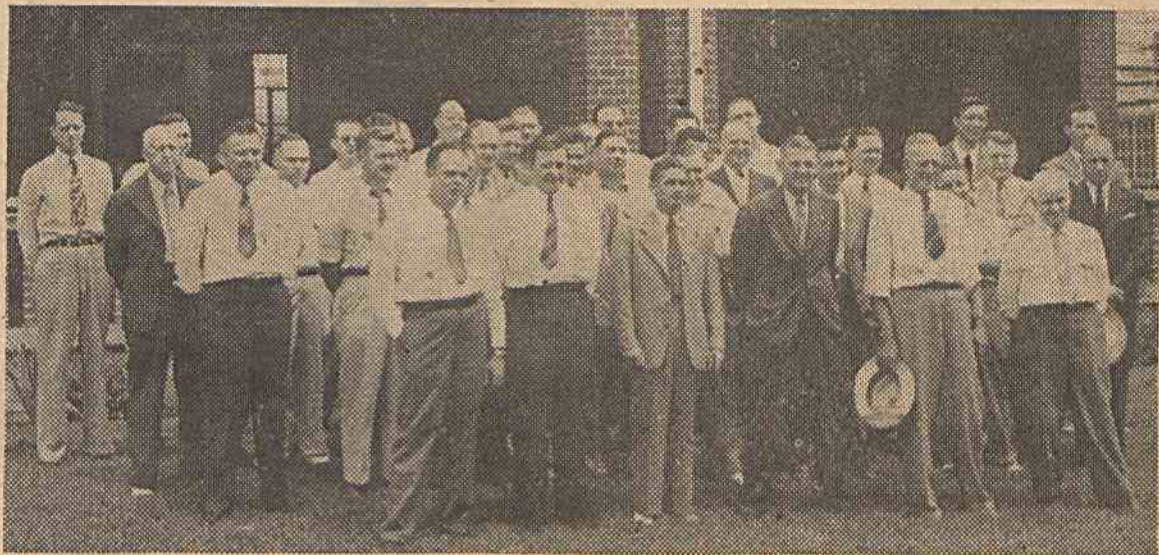
