Lois Holbert and Addelyn Ward enjoyed a nice week-end at Carolina Beach.

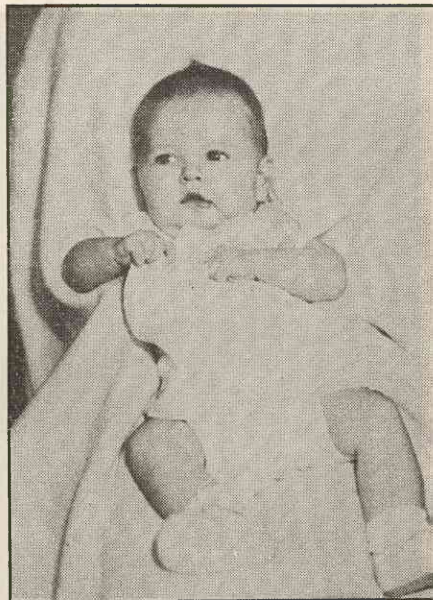
