Still in the lighter vein and a welcome change from the conventional is HOUND-DOG MAN by Fred Gipson. It will immediately remind you of THE YEARLING by Marjorie Kennan Rawlings. A hero-worshipping twelve-year-old shares a wonderful week of coon huntin' with a happy-go-lucky wanderer who represents the sum of all his youthful ambitions. If your brother, dad, or son spends hours on end hunting, then by all means borrow a copy of HOUND-DOG MAN, a tender picture of the relationship between a boy and his idol.
