Bill Hunter took a fast trip to Bristol, Virginia to broadcast with the Quartet over Station WOPI and to make appearances in four churches.

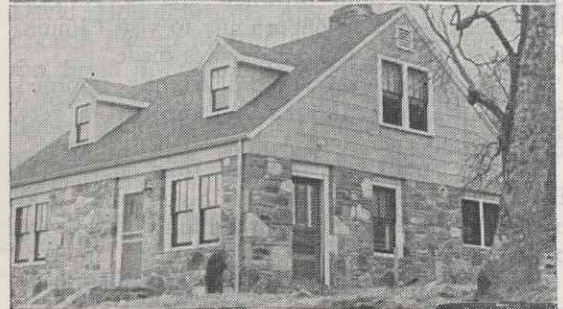
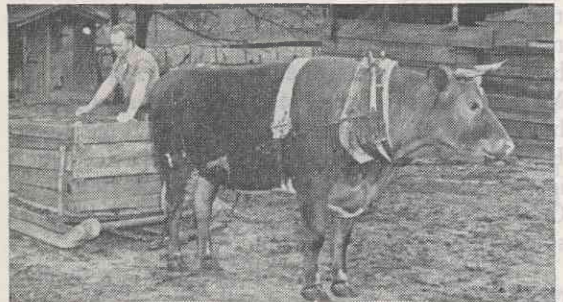
During the month of May, Lucy Clarke visited in Monk's Corner, South Carolina and in Anderson several times. (Blood pressure again, Lucy?)
