### KIDDY KORNER

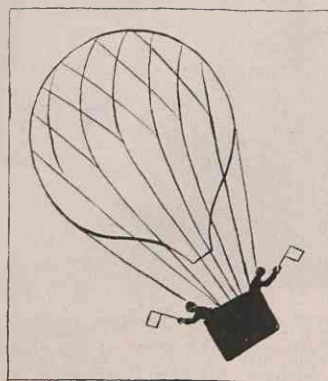
