Spring Expansion For Cafeteria and Bookstore

In the spring of 1968 Asheville-Biltmore's cafeteria area will be expanded. The size of both the cafeteria and the snack shop will be doubled.

A new bookstore will be built on the same level with the snack shop and the cafeteria. Its stock of merchandise will be larger and be in greater variety.

An added feature to the cafeteria will be a private dining area. This will accommodate various luncheons and dinners sponsored by A-B social organizations.

The present cafeteria and bookstore are too small for the anticipated expansion of the dormitory village. Plans include extending the cafeteria area outward to fill the unused space under the Student Center Auditorium. The new bookstore will

be built here, also. Rock and glass will be the major building materials.

Team Teaching Course Polled

Team teaching is preferred by the majority of students in the Introduction to Psychology class. This was shown on a recent survey given the class at A-B.

More than 70% felt that team teaching did not put teacher-student relationship on a level that was to impersonal. Eighty-six per cent of the students said they were learning more in this situation than they could in the single teacher system. Over one third however, agreed with the proposed statement,

"In a team teaching situation, a teacher does not become familiar enough with his students to grade them accurately."

Varying comments were made on the survey sheet. A large number shared the view that his method of instruction gives the student an opportunity to hear different ideas and thus are given a better understanding of subject matter. Others thought that there is something lost between student and teacher in this set up.

One person expressed himself in this way:

"We are considered numbers in this institution by most all teachers, so I can't see why team teaching would be a question."
