# ACLU Has Asked Supreme Court To Examine Students' Rights 

Washington, D.C. (CPS)Asserting that "college students are entitled to the identical First Amendment protections on the campus as they or any other citizen would have" in the community-at-large," the American Civil Liberties Union asked the Supreme

Court to review two cases: one involving demonstrations inside campus buildings, the other involving official recognition of student political organizations.
If the court agrees to hear the cases, it will mark the first time in 37 years that the Jus-

tices have addressed them-
selves to freedom of selves to freedom of speech and assembly for college students.
The ACLU noted that "by virtue of the 26 th amendment, almost every college student is now fully enfranchised and entitled to participate in the
