Dr. Isherwood to Speak

Robert M. Isherwood, a distinguished European historian and scholar, will lecture to the humanities sections on Tuesday, February 14 in the Humanities Lecture Hall at 1 p.m. His lecture on "Popular Mentalities in 17th- and 18th-Century France" will deal with some of France's intellectual trends of that period. That evening at 7:30, also in the Humanities Lecture Hall, he will address the public on "Popular Musical Entertainment in 18th-Century Paris." Dr. Isherwood's visit to the U.N.C.-A. campus is jointly sponsored by U.N.C.-A.'s chapter of Phi Alpha Theta, international honor society in history; and the University Committee on Cultural and Special Events.

Dr. Isherwood earned his B.A. at Allegheny College; and his M.A. and Ph.D. at the University of Chicago. Additionally, he has received many academic awards including the Hershel Shaw Fellowship, the Cleo Herren Fellowship, and the Woodrow Wilson Dissertation Grant. Presently an associate professor of history at Vanderbilt University, Dr. Isherwood has also taught at the University of New Hampshire and Vanderbilt-in-France.

Dr. Isherwood's interest in French culture has led him to present many papers on the subject at historical conventions and societies. In addition to numerous articles and reviews that have appeared in scholarly journals, Dr. Isherwood is also the author of one book, "Music in the Service of the King: France in the Seventeenth-Century".

The CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP organization will meet at 12 noon on Tuesday, February 14 in the Student Center Coffeehouse.

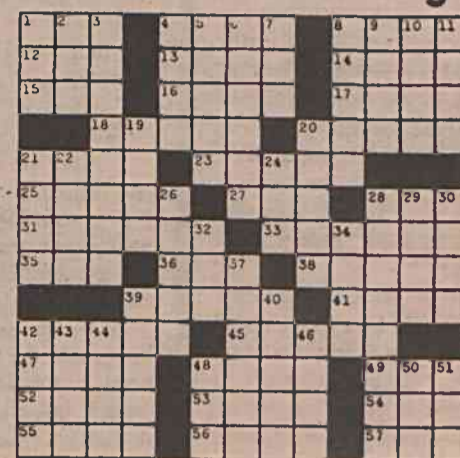

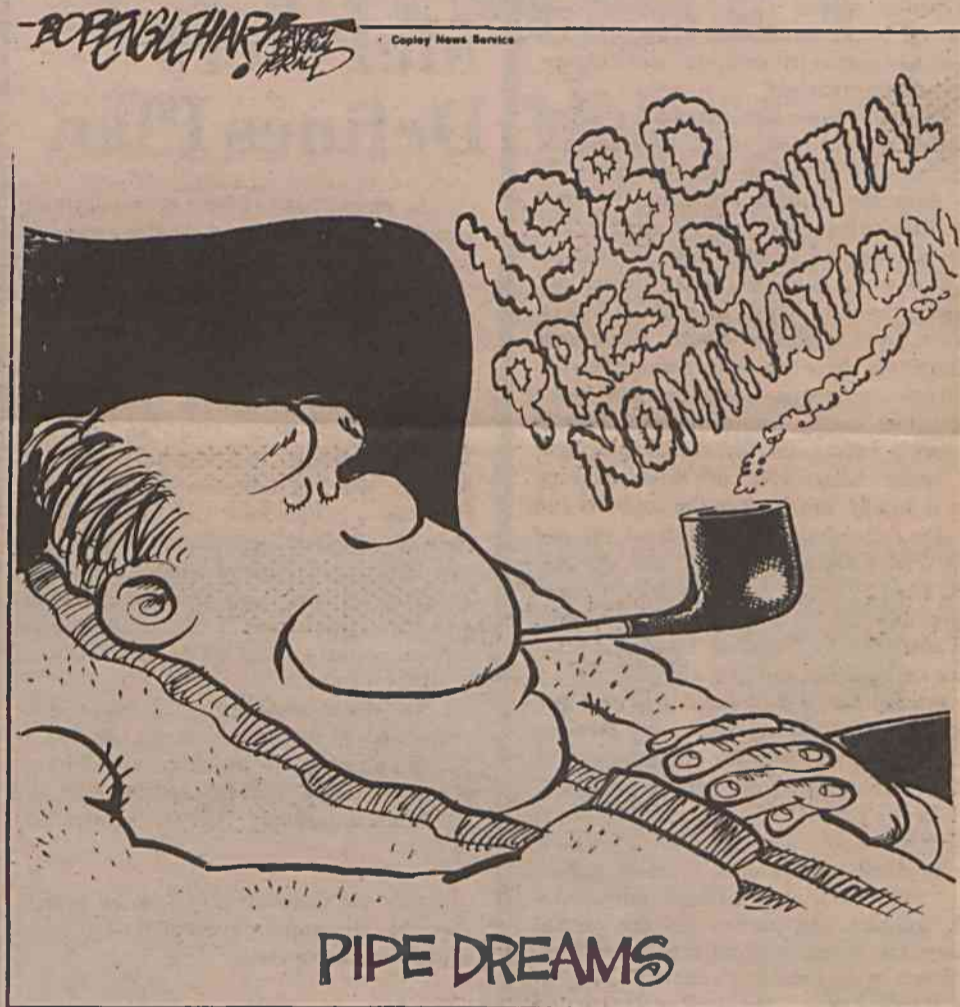
