(Dorr) We are working with admissions to develop a comprehensive recruiting plan, which is almost complete. We will also make a study of attrition to discover what causes students to drop out or to remain. For instance, we could use Sociology students to analyze this attrition... If one of the problems were bureaucracy, we could use the Management department to analyze the structure of our organization.

(RR) Do you forsee any restructuring within the university hierarchy?

(Dorr) We will look closely at the structure of departments and the role of the chair.

(RR) What are some other goals?

(Dorr) New and better housing is essential to the growth and development of UNC-A. This has to come out particularly in the search for a new Dean of Students.

LONG RANGE GOALS

(RR) What do you feel are UNC-A's long range goals?

(Dorr) Now would be a bit early to say. Things that come to mind are the Climatic Center and Forestry School. We must, over the years, diversify without dimishing our emphasis on liberal arts...Liberal arts are the real heart of this college.


