## Talk on Southern Jewish Identity

UNC Asheville's Center for Jewish Studies will present a talk on "Homelands: Southern-Jewish

Identity in Durham and Chapel Hill, North Carolina" by Leonard Rogoff at 7pm Thursday, Dec. 5, in UNCA's Owen Conference Center. This event is free and open to the public.

Rogoff, research historian for the Jewish Heritage Foundation of North Carolina, has written and lectured extensively on the Jewish South with a focus on North Carolina."
