ed me a paper and it was unbelievable," said Cline.

Cline took the men to Vice President of Student Services Jack Davis, who ordered them to pick up the papers and leave campus.

One of the men identified himself as Karles Messick. The name fits one of the writers in the paper, a Rev. Messick.

"He got upset when asked to leave and said he represented a legitimate church. He then told me he was on his way to UNCA," said Cline.

Messick drove a blue Volkswagon Rabbit registered to the church.

Cline called UNCA security to warn them, but the message arrived too late.

The men shoved papers under windshield wipers all over campus and departed before security got the call.

Carreno said the securi-

ty officers picked up about 100 of the papers.

Pat Cabe, student government vice president, saw two men wearing hooded camouflage jackets putting papers on cars behind the Highrise that afternoon.

"I just thought they were fraternity guys," said Cabe.

The intruders distributed two different issues, according to Carreno. One issue called the Santa Domingo issue dated January 1984, and the other, the White Student issue, dated December 1984.

Dr. Iovacchini, vice chancellor of student affairs, called the act "deplorable."

The question is whether the university can prevent campus dissemination of

similar material in the future.

"We can't jeopardize the freedom of speech guaranteed by the First Amendment. On the other hand, they are violating university policy," said Dr. Laurence Dorr, vice chancellor of academic affairs.

UNCA policy states any material distributed on campus must meet the approval of Iovacchini or another official.

"These men are not students and they were not invited here. They violated our regulations, and that gives us the right to ban them from campus and remove their material," said Carreno.

Cline said A-B Tech is in the process of drafting a letter to the church warning its followers not to appear again on campus.

However, Dr. Ileana Grams, assistant professor of philosophy, said changing people's attitudes is the key to ending racial hatred.

"There is no way to prevent this material from coming on campus, and I'm not sure it is our business to try to prevent it," said Grams, director of the UNCA Jewish Studies Center.

"What we can do is open students' minds through a liberal education. It is also important to respond to this type of material, because to ignore it is to just assume it is O.K.," said Grams.
