

Joy Nicholes suggested a parking garage as a possible solution.

Promoting interaction between commuting students and dorm residents was another concern.

Students suggested more activities within majors and departments, and resident vs. commuter intramural sports as two possible ways to spur contact between on- and off-campus lifestyles.

The group also tackled other issues including:

- clarifying the university's main entrance;
- beautifying the land between the two front entrances (a parking lot is scheduled for construction in this area by next spring);
- providing bike racks and lockers for commuters;
- using uniform materials when constructing new walkways or rebuilding old
