The men's soccer team finished regular season play Thursday night at the Asheville High soccer field against Wake Forest, dropping the game 3-0.

The Bulldogs begin post-season play Saturday when they travel to Winthrop College for the first round in the single elimination tournament.

Originally, the game was scheduled to be at UNCA, but UNCA was notified Tuesday that the game would be at Winthrop.

UNCA, which finished fifth in the conference, beat Winthrop, ranked fourth, 1-0 earlier in the season and was set to be the host team. But Paul Adams, UNCA's sports information director, said that due to some changes in the complicated point system, the game

was switched to be played at Winthrop.

The game will be at 1 p.m. Saturday. If UNCA wins, they will play in the semi-finals on Nov. 21. The finals of the tournament are on Nov.

In the Wake Forest game, the Demon Deacons scored their first goal at 18:34 of the first half.

Four minutes later, Wake Forest struck again. The Bulldogs left the field at the half with a 2-0 defecit.

UNCA came back in the second half playing aggressive defense. They held Wake Forest in check until the Deacs scored their final goal with only 19 seconds left in the game.

The Bulldogs finished the season with a 7-12-1 record. Wake Forest improved its record to




