
"Do you think the current library hours are adequate for students?"

"Most of the time I think they're open long enough. During vacations it's hard because I'm a commuter and they close down the campus. That's (the library) the only thing I'd like to see opened."





John Munson Freshman Environmental Science

Sheila Shuford Sophomore Computer Science


