NOTICE TO SUPPLEMENTAL LOAN BORROWERS

To comply with requirements of Public Law 100-369, which went into effect October 1, 1988, Lenders will multiply disburse SLS (Supplemental Loan for Students) loan proceeds when the loan amount is over \$1000 and when there are over 180 days remaining in the loan period. Specifically you will notice these changes:

- 1.No single disbursement may exceed one-half of the total loan amount.
- 2.The loan may be disbursed in two or three checks.
- 3.The second disbursement

will not occur until one-third of the total school year for which the loan is specified has past.
